1. Take good notes in class. If you've missed something, ask to borrow a classmate's notes.
2. Review your class notes every night and memorize new words and grammatical features.
3. Make a vocabulary list or flashcards in order to memorize new words and phrases.
4. Spend at least 15 minutes studying every night (this does not include homework exercises).
5. Bring questions to class and ask to practice words or phrases that you don't understand. Your teacher will be happy to help.
6. Do your homework every night without looking at the answers in the book. If you want to go back and check and change the answers, that is fine, but doing the exercises without looking will help you gauge what you know and what you don't know, in order to study more effectively.
