Born at Mentar, Kans., Aug. 6, 1883, Mrs. Emery was educated in the schools of Mentar and was a graduate of Kansas Wesleyan University, Salina, Kan. On May 29, 1907, she was married to William E. Emery, whom she met while in the university, and the couple left for California to make their home.

Mrs. Emery resided in California until after the death of her husband in August 1956, after which she moved from Long Beach, Calif., to Salem to reside with her daughter, Mrs. Randall V. (Hazel) Mills, who is with the Oregon State Library. Mrs. Emery was a member of the Ebell Club, Long Beach and the First Methodist Church, Long Beach.

Surviving besides the daughter are son, Edwin Emery, Minneapolis, Minn.; brothers, Forrest Miller and Cleve D. Miller, both Salina, Kan., and two grandchildren.

Shipment is being made to Christensen-Pino Mortuary, Long Beach, by Virgil T. Golden Chapel for services and interment. Services will be held Dec. 31, at 11 a.m. and interment will be in Long Beach.

Crash Kills Salinans' Sister

Mrs. Floyd Edwards, sister of Cleve Miller, 756 Highland, and Forrest Miller, 749 South Santa Fe, died Monday in Las Animas, Colo. of injuries suffered Saturday in a car accident near there. Details of the accident are unknown to relatives in Salina, and time of the funeral is not yet known.

Mrs. Edwards, who was in her late fifties, was the former Grace Miller, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. V. W. Miller, pioneers of the Mentor neighborhood, where she was born. She had been teaching in Syracuse, where the family lives. Both she and her husband were graduated at Kansas Wesleyan university. A daughter and three sons survive with the husband.

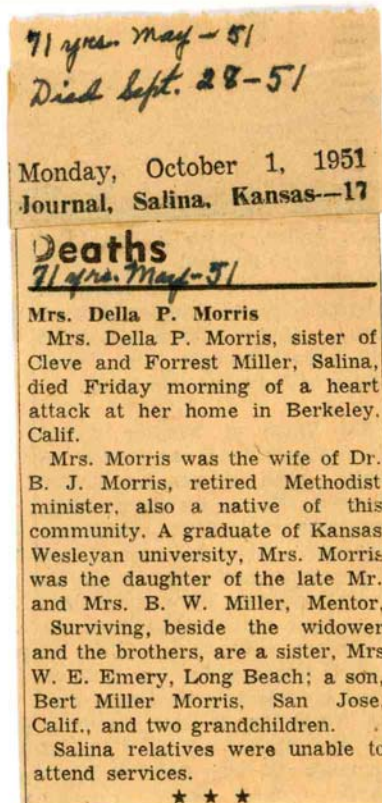
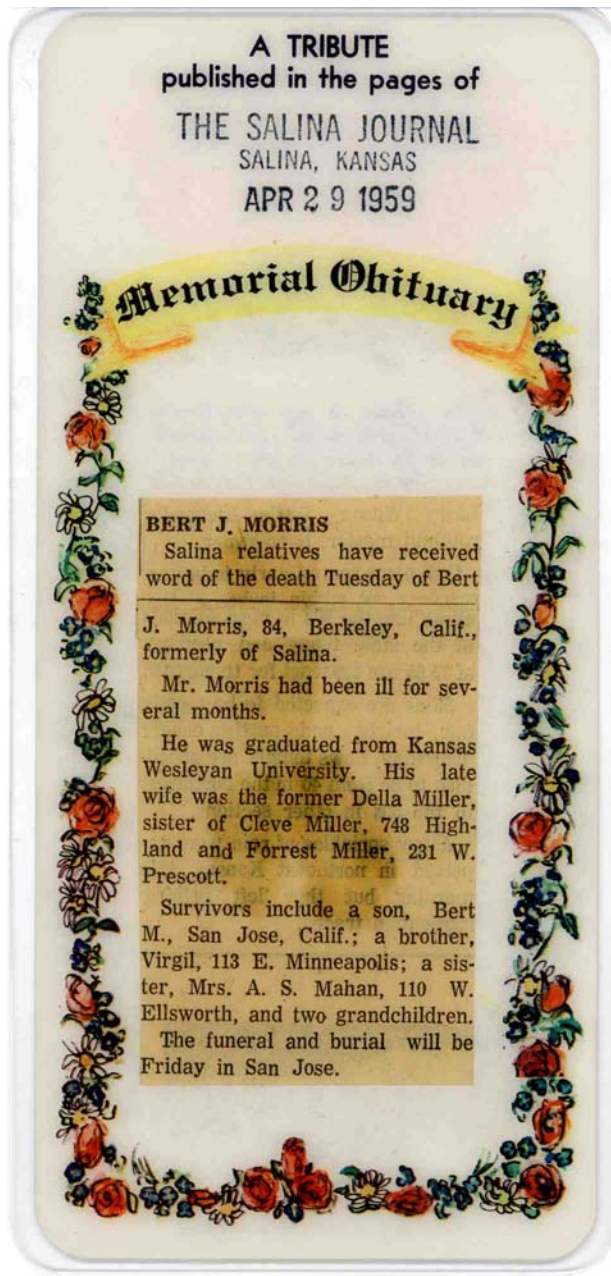
