The Millers who moved to Kansas from Tennessee descend from:

- 1. <u>Peter Miller Sr.</u>, d 1824 or later in Washington Co., Tennessee & m. Elizabeth Boone ca 1776 in Frizzelburg, Frederick (now Carroll) County, Maryland. Miller was of German descent, but it is not known where he was born. Six children. (Elizabeth's father, Johann Diel Bohne/Bohn, b ca 1711, came to America in 1741 on the *Marlborough* with his wife, Mary, and some children. He left a will in Frederick County, Maryland in 1764; Elizabeth is named in the will.)
- 2. <u>Jacob Miller Sr.</u>, b 30 Jun 1779, in Virginia and d 18 November 1858, near Limestone, Washington County, Tennessee. He and many members of his family are buried in the Mount Bethel Christian Church Cemetery, two miles up Jockey Creek from Limestone and just across the line in Greene County, Tennessee. He gave the land for this cemetery and church. The church is still active and my husband and I visited there in about 1999. He married Elizabeth Range, b 21 Jan 1777 and d 25 Aug 1843; m2) Mrs. Hannah Broyles, widow, on 2 Jun 1845. He had ten children with his first wife.
- 3. John Range Miller (see below). He and his wife had 11 children.

Six sons of John Range Miller (1815 – 1895) and Elizabeth Clark Miller (1820 VA – 1898 TN) of Limestone, Washington County, Tennessee, moved to Kansas, starting with Valentine W. Miller in 1874. The sons were:

- 2. Jacob Clark Miller (1851 1944) m. Magnolia Tivis Harris
- 3. Daniel Ludrick Miller (1853-1943) m. Mollie L. Harris

- 5. Abram Michael Miller (1858 1947) m. Laurena Frankie Broyles
- 6. John Edwin T. Miller (1861-1943) m. Ida Lurenah Bolton, called Lula

There are so many descendants that a Miller picnic has been held every summer in the City Park at Marquette, McPherson County, Kansas.
