William Leaton

Died, Nov. 23, 1907, aged 80 years. He was born at Hanover, Germany, in 1827 and came to America in 1838. He was married to Miss Lucinda Victoria Davis, at Hannible [sic: Hannibal], Mo., in 1855, who now survives him. Of this union twelve children were born, ten of whom are living: Mars. Rose Pace, Mrs. Maggie Springer, Mrs. Levi Smith, Mrs. Agnes Fall, Mrs. T.S. McCutcheon, Mrs. Will Pace, Mrs. J.C. Brummett, William, John, and Lewis Leaton.

Mr. Leaton had been a resident of Saline county for 38 years and by his frugality and close attention to business had accumulated a moderate little fortune, and by his deeds of kindness and acts of charity won the confidence and esteem of all who knew him. No stranger was ever turned from his door and no application from the needy was ever disregarded. It can be truly said of him that "he never allowed his left hand to know what his right hand was doing." Deceased was a good man, following humbly in the steps of his Master. His death removes from our midst a good husband, kind loving father and a faithful friend. – J.C. Brummett

WILLIAM LEATON, P.O., Marshall. Was born in Hanover, Germany, in the year 1828, and when ten years of age, came with his parents to the United Stated. They landed at Baltimore, and located at Wheeling, Virginia, where he lived sixteen years. He then moved to Ohio, and lived there two years; then to Adams county, Illinois; then to Missouri, where he has been living ten years, most of the time in Saline county. Two years ago he purchased the farm of 240 acres on which he now lives, and which is all under fence, and is either in plow-land or pasture. In the year 1856 he was married to Miss Lucinda Davis, daughter of Thomas Davis, of Adams county, Illinois. They have had eleven children, of whom nine are now living: Rose A., wife of Martin Pace of this county; Hannah M., wife of Eugene Springer, of Pettis county, Missouri; Allie, wife of Levi Smith, of this county; Agnes, Adelaide, Fannie, Mary J., Aggie, William, and Josephine. They are all of the Methodist belief. Mr. Leaton served in the Fifty-sixth Illinois volunteers during the war, having been drafter. He began life with very little, and has now a handsome farm, well stocked.
